
VUD GETS NEW EDITOR / PUBLISHER



Once again a packet of mail came from our old Buffalo post box and once again we step into the twilight zone. One letter contained a tape which is labeled "96.7 FM the Undaground" and a Columbus, OH address. The letter that accompanied it says"the Undaground"...we are the best radio/tv station in the cosmos. I'm Frankie B, your host...we are the new money makers in communication around the world." So, I put the tape in the deck and put the phones on and gave it a listen. Thanks to Chip Kelley, Dennis Smith, Tom Yingling, Joe Martin, Saul Chernos, Jeff Kitsko, Jeffery Bryant, and Chris Clayton - some of them via the WTFDA mailing list - for information in this month's column. Note the new abbreviations PR (request for change in power) and QR. (Request for change in frequency)

There's another high-powered low-band station reported on the air this month. KBJN-3 in Nevada should be a good skip target for our central and western members. I have no idea what they're running for programming. There's another new VHF station on the air, KBAO-13 in Montana, but that's going to be a tough one. Note also the programming change at new KBGF-3 Arizona (from Daystar to Univision). Also, note applications and grants for four powerful LPTVs on the low band - W15AP in Alabama requesting 3kw on channel 4; KVNJ-LP in North Dakota requesting 1kw on channel 2; KWBP near Portland, Oregon granted 2.5kw on channel 4; and KCVB in Logan, Utah moving from channel 12 to run 1.5kw on channel 3. All are potential skip targets.

Both applicants for channel 42 in Vancouver propose multilingual ethnic operations.

Jeffery reports the LPTV clusters in Cape Girardeau and Poplar Bluff, Missouri are both off the air, or more accurately, never operated. The stations in Cape are K33EQ, K35EN, K47FB, K55HL, K58FD, K65GP, K67HF, and K69HT; those in Poplar Bluff are K26EC, K28ED, K31EB, K35EP, K56FP, K59FE, K61FY, and K68FL.

There's a correction to the MLB baseball station list. Jeff Kitsko says WCWB-22 Pittsburgh carries some of the Pirates games; they also have a cable affiliate. Also in Pittsburgh,

WNPA-19 is now carrying a local newscast. It's produced by KDKA-2 and uses KDKA anchors.

Dennis reports two local LPTVs off the air: K08MP and KVMM-LP (41) are both gone, at least for the time being. DXing from Wasco, California, several other LPTVs were noted off - Bakersfield's KMMB-LP 4, K10OH, K42EJ, and K50CL; Hanford's KHMM-LP 16; KKAK-LP 20 in Porterville; K40DQ Tulare; and K63EC Planada. He suspects K08MP's exciter is still on as he's seeing faint CCI on KFMB-8. KCET-28 has dropped its overnight relay of ARTS (the Classic Arts Showcase); it's no longer broadcasting 24 hours.

Tom Yingling found a review of two cards which allow high-definition DTV reception on a PC. The popular Hauppage WinTV-D card allows reception of high-definition stations, but the video is downconverted to standard-definition 640x480. Hauppage now has a card that will display high-definition signals in high definition. And they now have some competition. The review is on Cnet, on <u>http://www.cnet.com/electronics/0-3219398-8-6807013-1.html</u>.

Frank Aden threw one heck of a show in Boise. The trip up Deer Point was especially interesting. (Thanks to Dave Nieman for the ride; my car's brakes have had enough of mountaintop trips after Whiteface Mountain last year<grin>) I was worried that nobody would show up for a convention that far west. There was no need to worry. I especially enjoyed seeing people I've not seen in many years (I.e., Mike Hawk) and who I've never met before. (I.e., Frank, and Dave Janowiak) Travelling was memorable as well. One or two of the vacation pictures on <u>http://www.geocities.com/w9wi</u> are DX-related... Next year, we'll be convening in Oklahoma City; here's hoping we'll see all of you there!

DX hasn't been half bad either. I got a pretty good batch of meteor-scatter loggings on the car radio on my way home from Boise. Midwestern DXers caught a nice tropo opening the week after the convention. And there was a great Es opening, including channel 7 skip, after that. I don't think anybody's got anything to complain about in 2001!

The equipment I used was my old Sears B&W 10" with UHF 4-bay conical 16ft/5m AG & VHF 1-bay conical 10ft/3m AG. In the past, 1954 to 1974, bigger antennas at 45ft/12m AG & Zenith TV also gave fair to weak, though regular reception from VHFs in Los Angeles (11/185), San Diego (70/110), Springville (45/75), Salinas (150/240), San Jose (175/280), San Francisco (220/350), Stockton (200/320), and Sacramento (240/385). There are also newer VHF LPTVs in Bakersfield and Fresno, that I have not yet seen in Wasco with my present equipment.

My last new Wasco logging was April 10 with Ch. 27 duplicating KBFX-LP 58 (Fox) Bakersfield. This <u>may</u> be the former K40DQ Tulare which translated KMPH 26 (Fox) Visalia. K40DQ was to move to ch. 27 as K27FQ, so I am guessing that it has moved to Bakersfield as ny antenna heading is best to Bakersfield for both Chs. 27 and 58. This makes number 195 in my reconstructed Wasco TV total, subject to revision. The total does not include four tentative loggings in this bandscan (along with KCPM [now KNVN]-24 Chico [350/560] and KCMY [now KSPX]-29 Sacramento [235.365], both received in the early 1990s only as CCI behind locals), thoiugh I wonder at what point to be sufficiently certain of the signals without ID to count them.

The skip DX has not been good in recent years on any of my scattered trips to Wasco, with only some relogs and unIDs. My last new Es logging was July 4, 1972.

Left over from my Paradise report of last month: Correct my error/uncertainty re: UPN of WB affiliation of KMAX –31 vs KQCA-58 in Sacramento/Stockton market: KMAX-31 is UPN and KQCA-58 is WB, as they have been.

ASK WTFDA

Q. I'd like to know if the antennas Radio Shack sells are as good as those made by Channel Master or Winegard.

A. I don't know how anyone can compare Winegard or Channel Master antennas to Radio Shack. I've been in the antenna business for almost 18 years and I've tried a lot of brands including Antennacraft/Radio Shack.

If you live in any kind of high wind or icing area you can figure on a 1-2 year life expectancy on a Radio Shack antenna compared to a 15-20 year life with a Winegard, Channel Master, TDP or Cometic.

Radio Shack's design is one of the poorest in regards to phasing designs as well as poor across the band vswr, beamwidths and front-back ratios.

In Western New York we have many challenging installation areas with all the mountains. I can tell you of thousands of times where we have gone into customers' homes with a Radio Shack antenna with complaints of poor signals and we replaced it with a Winegard or Channel Master and saw the peoples' head twist with awe!

As far as pricing goes look at the Winegard Prostar line. Compare the number of elements per inch with Radio Shack's. (PS...Radio Shack counts both sides of the same dipole as 2 elements; this is cheating). Then look at what you're getting for cost. I believe you'll find you get more for your money. With the construction designs and structural quality I think you would be surprised.

If you considering raising the antenna higher you should consider a way to keep the elements locked in place. Around here most Radio Shack antennas either have no rear elements or they are all fold over each other.

About the only antennas I like from Antennacraft (Radio Shack's producer) are the p-7 and p-5 parabolics and a few of the Antennacraft MXU uhf corner reflectors. They also produce the old RCA line from 20 years ago commonly known to our industry as the blue gold line. Also a TDP antenna for some time. These are built to some very rugged standards and we use them along with Winegard for most of our installs. –Rich Wertman
